NEW MINOR CANON AND BISHOP'S CHAPLAIN

We are delighted to announce that the Bishop has appointed the Rev'd Dr Emma L. Whittick as Minor Canon of the Cathedral and Bishop's Chaplain. Emma will divide her time equally between the two posts. She will begin her new ministry with us after Christmas. Below you will find her short biography and we wish her well with her move.



Emma grew up in Oxfordshire and moved to Wales to study Mathematics at Aberystwyth where she became a Christian having previously had no contact with church. Following a brief career as a teacher, Emma returned to academia to complete a Masters and PhD. She then worked as a Deanery Evangelist, helping the 25 Anglican Churches in the Aberystwyth area share the Gospel in their communities. This led to exploring a call to ordained ministry. Emma was ordained in 2015, serving her Curacy in Dafen and Felinfoel (near Llanelli) in the Diocese of St Davids and then working as Chaplain to the University of Wales, Trinity Saint David at the Lampeter and Carmarthen Campuses.

In addition to her work at the University, Emma contributes regularly to religious broadcasting on BBC radio, she enjoys a variety of sports and plays the viola and guitar. She's a member of the Society of Contemporary Evangelists, the Fellowship for Parish Evangelism and is a Trustee for a Christian Healing Charity. Emma is delighted to be appointed to this new role and is very much looking forward to getting to know the Cathedral community in the coming months.

PRAYER VIGIL FOR PEACE

In the light of the war in Ukraine and the violence we are witnessing in the Holy Land, there will be a Prayer Vigil for Peace in the Cathedral every Tuesday at 6pm for the foreseeable future. The service will take no more than half and hour.

CHOIR TRUST TREASURER

The Choir trust exists to provide funding for our Cathedral choir, helping to pay for the Director of Music salary, music lessons for the choristers and much more. The investments are in excess of £1.2 million. The investments are looked after by an equity firm. Our present treasurer is due to retire at the end of the year and we are looking for someone to replace him. This is not a big job as the trust only meets twice a year. The present treasurer estimates that it takes around 50 hours a year of his time. Please speak to Fr Steven or the Dean if you have a suggestion of who might be prepared to take on this role.

COLLECTION PLATE CARD READERS

It has come to our attention that the card readers contained in the collection plates have not been transmitting any payments since October 2022 when the Cathedral router was changed, and a new password established. This was not immediately evident, but it seems the payments have been stored in the units but not transmitted for payment. We intend to reconnect the units, but this will mean stored payments will be processed. If you have given regularly by card reader during the period affected it may be that several payments are taken at once. If this causes a problem, do speak to the clergy or Chapter Treasurer and we will arrange a refund. The card reader near the entrance is not affected. We do apologize for any inconvenience this may cause.

LAST SUNDAY'S SET-UP

The arrangement of the choir singing in the chancel and administration of communion standing at the nave, was a 'one off' experiment for the choir and conductor to have a sense of how it would feel with new choir stalls particularly designed for choirs. These were brought from the Cathedral song room, but have now been returned. Be assured this was for one week only to help us gauge the sound. The feedback from some members of the congregation was also most helpful. Firstly, the choir was too far away from the congregation. Secondly, the sound was weaker. From the choir perspective, they were too close to the organ pipes. They couldn't hear themselves singing. Thank you for your patient understanding. Back to normal this Sunday.
